HISTORIC ST. GEORGE LIVE! Tours Suggested "One Tank" Place to Visit in 2016

If you have ever wanted to meet a real pioneer, time is running out to do it. Brigham Young, Erastus Snow, Orson Pratt, Jacob Hamblin, Judge John Menzies Macfarlane and a woman pioneer are packing their bags to leave St. George after three months getting acquainted with people at the Historic St. George LIVE! tours. Since many families are looking for "one-tank vacations" within Utah, this is a perfect fit. The tours will end on Wednesday, August 31.

The tours begin at 10 a.m. daily on Tuesdays through Saturdays at the Art Museum in the Pioneer Center for the Arts, 47 East 200 North (across from the Main Post Office). Ticket prices are \$3 per person for guests 12 and older; younger children are free with an adult. Each ticket also admits one person free to the Carousel in the Town Square.

Buses take visitors to each venue including the Opera House, Tabernacle, Pioneer Courthouse, DUP Museum, and Brigham Young's home. Restrooms and water are available. Guests interact with the pioneers, see a replica of the odometer that crossed the Plains, participate in a water stealing trial, hear the stories of the settlers and gain a new appreciation for those who came before us.

Historic St. George LIVE! tours are planned to entertain family and school reunions, youth and church groups, women's and business lunch clubs, newcomers, long-time residents, tourists and bus tours. Volunteers include prominent residents of Washington County, mostly retired, who devote a week each summer to playing the part of the pioneer, bus driver or tour guide.
