Due to the closure of the St. George Tabernacle for a few months, we will be holding our last two Legacy Lecture Series presentations this spring in two different venues:

- On Monday, April 1, we will have the pleasure of hearing from **Jonathan T. Pike, Utah Insurance Commissioner, and former Mayor of St. George**. We will be meeting in Lecture Hall 156 of the Russell C. Taylor Health Science Center, located on the St. George Regional Hospital campus at 1526 Medical Center Drive (where we used to meet for our President's Colleagues group for many years).
- On Monday, May 6, we will be meeting in the Dunford Auditorium on the Utah Tech University campus. Our speaker will be **Derral Eves, Co-Founder and Executive Producer of The Chosen series**. He will talk about how he became involved with The Chosen and will discuss many of his experiences.

Jonathan T. Pike has served as Utah Insurance Commissioner since January 5, 2021. Pike worked in several positions with Intermountain Health from 1990 through 2020, including 26 years as the southwest Utah operations director for Select Health, the health insurance division of Intermountain. He also served as the project manager for the design and construction of St. George Regional Hospital from 1999 through 2003.

In 2007, Pike was elected to the St. George City Council and in 2013 he was elected mayor of St. George, where he served until January of 2021. Pike currently serves on the boards of Encircle St. George, the Southwest Utah Symphony and Orchestra, the Southern Utah Performing Arts Foundation, and as a member of the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. He previously served as the President of the Utah League of Cities and Towns Board and as a Trustee of Dixie State University (now Utah Tech University) for twelve years.

Pike received a bachelor's degree in finance from the University of Utah and an MBA from Westminster College. Pike loves singing, playing the piano, organ, and guitar, as well as water and snow skiing, motorcycling and walking or biking on St. George's many beautiful trails. He and his wife Kristy have five children and eight grandchildren.
